

UPCOMING CHANGES TO NAPLAN REPORTING

Ahead of NAPLAN results for students being released from Monday 17th July 2023, I'm writing to inform you of some changes to this year's reporting. These are changes being introduced nationally by the Australian Curriculum Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA).

NAPLAN will continue to measure student achievement in Numeracy, Reading, Writing, Spelling, and Grammar and Punctuation but the results will now be presented in four proficiency levels: These are:

- exceeding
- strong
- developing
- needs additional support.

This change will give schools, parents and carers clearer information that details student achievement against new proficiency levels.

Students' NAPLAN reports will continue to show how they are tracking against their peers and provide an indication of their skill levels against national averages and where we would expect them to be in order to get the most out of schooling. This provides valuable information to teachers about how we can continue to support your child.

Each set of NAPLAN results is an important milestone but it's also important that students know that one result does not define them – these results are about making sure every student gets the support they need so they can continue to get the best from their learning. When we provide you with your results, you will also receive information about what the new proficiency levels mean.

As ever, you're welcome to speak to me, or your child's teacher with any questions about these changes.

STAY WELL THIS WINTER

In Victoria, influenza (flu) and respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) infection numbers are high among children aged 5 to 11 years, particularly in those in their first few years of school. The Victorian Department of Health expects more respiratory infections over Term 3.

Most children with flu or RSV have a mild fever, runny nose or cough. Some children, particularly babies and children with underlying medical conditions, may have more severe illness.

Keeping our school community well

Parents, carers and students are encouraged to:

- wash and sanitise their hands regularly
- avoid touching eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands
- cover their nose and mouth when coughing or sneezing · stay at home if unwell and consult a general practitioner (GP) or NURSE-ON-CALL as needed
- stay up to date with flu and COVID-19 vaccinations.

Our school has masks for staff, students and visitors if they want to wear them. Flu vaccinations

Vaccination is the best way to protect yourself and your family from getting the flu. Annual flu vaccination is recommended for everyone aged 6 months and older. As part of the National Immunisation Program, it is free for:

- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people aged 6 months and older
- children aged 6 months to under 5 years
- people aged 6 months or older with underlying medical conditions.

Flu vaccinations can be booked through GPs, pharmacies or your local council immunisation service.

SCHOOL GROUNDS IMPROVEMENTS

During the recent holiday period a few projects were completed in the school grounds.

A new set of AFL goalposts were installed on the oval. I would sincerely like to thank two former families of the school for their assistance with this. Marty and Simone O'Keefe and Mick Bailey did the installation of the posts during the school holidays for free, saving us a couple of thousand dollars. Marty has also found us some netting which he is going to install over the windows of LA29/30 to protect them from flying footies.

New basketball backboards and rings were installed on the basketball court, making our avid basketballers very happy.

You may have noticed lots of poles and other items painted with yellow or contrasting paint. This is to allow them to stand out to our students for safety reasons.

We had our annual Tree Safety Audit completed with associated pruning and our trees now meet the Australian Standard with regard to safety.

We usually have a plumbing company come in and clear all of the guttering on our buildings and the storm water drains and pits and, most importantly, throw all of the balls and PE equipment down from the roofs. However, for one reason or another, this did not take place. I have contacted the company and hopefully they will be able to complete it next week.

THEIRCARE INFO

TheirCare has exciting news to announce about the Australian Government changes to the Child Care Subsidy (CCS), for your Outside School Hours Care Service.

From July 10th families who were previously not eligible to claim the CCS due to income limits, may now be eligible. In addition, most families who use or wish to use the OSHC Service provided by TheirCare, will save money.

SWIMMING

The Term 3 Swimming Program for students in Foundation to Grade 6 commences next week. The program will be held at Reservoir Leisure Centre, Cuthbert Road, Reservoir, a heated indoor venue that will run for five consecutive weeks on Tuesdays and Wednesdays. The leisure centre provides fully qualified instructors and staff members from school assisting on pool deck. This year the swimming program is free of charge, due to the Victorian Government Schools funding.

However, due to limited spots, if the demand exceeds our capacity, students in years 5 and 6 will have first priority, followed by students in years 3 and 4, and so on. This priority is determined by the Department of Education.

Due to the high demand, it appears that currently our Foundation students are likely to miss out. This will confirmed on Friday, after the Compass event closes. Please keep an eye out for a newsfeed on Friday from Amanda setting out confirmation of the year levels attending and a revised timetable.

GRANDPARENT OPEN SESSION

























STAFFING AND LEADERSHIP

WELLBEING CURRICULUM: WHAT'S HAPPENING THIS TERM?

Building a Culture of Respect and Equality

At RWPS, we take a whole -school approach to embedding a culture of respect and equality across our entire school, from our classrooms to staffroom, playground, sporting events and community celebrations. This approach leads to positive impacts on students' learning, their mental health, classroom behaviour and relationships between teachers and students.

The Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationship curriculum is just one of the ways that we are building a culture of respect and equality across the school. At RWPS, we also promote gender equality through the books that are selected for the library, the leadership opportunities that are offered to both students and staff, capturing different perspectives and views of our school community, celebrating diversity through learning about and marking a range of special days across the year and providing information on mental health and wellbeing through our school newsletter.

Respectful Relationships Lessons – Term 3

This term students in Foundation to Years 3/4 are focusing on problem solving, stress management, and positive coping skills.

The Year 5/6s will also learn about healthy ways to problem solve, and also delve into emotional literacy: recognising various types of emotions, how they affect the body and what to do about them.

Problem-solving

Children of ALL ages face problems and challenges on a daily basis. Examples of this include toy-related conflicts, disagreements on the rules of a game and negative peer pressure. Parents and teachers can't be there to solve every problem for children. Nor would we want to. For children to grow into confident, independent, and successful individuals, they need to learn how to solve problems by themselves. Children with problem-solving skills can manage their emotions, think creatively, and persist until they find a solution.

Problem-solving is one of the eight topics of social and emotional learning covered in Respectful Relationships. At RWPS, across each year level the Respectful Relationship program provides a number of learning activities to develop students' problem-solving skills. The activities in the program assist students to develop their critical and creative thinking skills, and to apply them to scenarios exploring personal, social and ethical dilemmas.



At home you can help your child develop problem-solving skills by:

- Demonstrating a willingness to make mistakes and try various solutions. It's ok if the first solution doesn't work!
- Modelling problem solving skills and thinking-aloud, so that children become familiar with strategies e.g. what are the advantages and disadvantages?
- Having discussions about what is out of our control and what is within our control. As we're solving a problem, we should focus on the things we can actually control.
- Show children that you value their opinion by asking for their advice. This also gives them opportunities to practice problem solving and develops their confidence to attempt these skills on their own.

Whole School Incursion – Backflips Against Bullying

On Friday, 18th of August the National Day of Action against Bullying and Violence is recognised. In recognition of this day, we have booked a whole school incursion for **Thursday**, **27th July**. The incursion is run by Action Education and is called 'Backflips Against Bullying.' You might have seen them on the news. The creator is autistic, had many bullying challenges at school and wanted to create an incursion that is evidence based, engaging for students and also educational. Here is a link to his interview.



The incursion will cover:

- Empowering the Bystander
- Exit Strategies for the victim
- Deliberate: Social exclusion
- The consequences of retaliation
- Whole School Action

All you need to do is get onto Compass and give consent for your child to attend the incursion.

Primary School Nursing Program - School Nurse Visit

Our Department of Education Visiting School Nurse, Suzy Pastro, is visiting Reservoir West Primary School in the 3rd week of term. She may make contact with Foundation parents that have consented and completed the questionnaire forms prior to and after this date.

Please keep an eye out for emails (and your junk inbox) from the Visiting School Nurse with the subject title 'RWPS School Entrant Health Questionnaire'.

The Primary School Nursing Program also accepts referrals for children in grades 1 – 6, children attending English Language Centre Schools and primary school-aged children who have recently arrived in Australia from overseas. If you or your child's teacher has concerns about your child's

health or development, your child can be referred to the school nurse at any time using a referral form.

Direct health assessment services provided under the Primary School Nursing Program may include:

- Vision screening
- Hearing screening
- Mouth check
- General developmental assessments

A health assessment under the Primary School Nursing Program is not intended to replace your normal source of health care. If you would like your child to be referred, please see your child's classroom teacher to complete a referral form.
